Roll Call: All Trustees and the Fiscal Officer were present.

Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

The Board led the audience to recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Executive Session

2025-29 Mr. Radtke moved to enter into executive session at 9:01 AM pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 121.22 (G)(4) reviewing negotiations with public employee(s) concerning their compensation and other terms and conditions of employment and pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 121.22 G(1), to consider compensation and discipline of public employee(s).

Mr. Mazzurco seconded. Roll call vote: Mr. Radtke, yes; Mr. Mazzurco, yes; Mr. Richter, yes. Motion passed.

Invited into the executive session is Police Chief Craig Young, Captain Sherwood, John Onyshko, Township Administrator Mark Purchase and Fiscal Officer Patricia Jarrett.

The Board reentered public session at 9:13 AM.

Road Department Building / Roof Renovation Project

The Road Superintendent, John Onyshko and the Board of Trustees discussed the necessities for the Road Department building regarding the roof, foundation repair and building a new structure. Mr. Onyshko will build a table of cost estimates and Mr. Radtke will communicate with nearby municipalities that have recently developed new buildings. When gathered information is complete the Board of Trustees and the Road Superintendent will meet again.

Cemetery Fees

John Onyshko proposed Chester cemetery burials conclude by 1:30 PM due to road workers availability and overtime pay.

2025-30 Mr. Radtke moved to approve all proposed changes to the Cemetery Pricing and Services as recommended by the Road Superintendent.

Mr. Mazzurco seconded. Vote unanimous; motion passed.

Recycle Park Driveway Repairs

The entrance and exit of the Recycle Park driveway are deteriorating. Mr. Mazzurco and the Road Superintendent, John Onyshko discussed solutions for the driveway. Asphalt and a gravel base may help relieve the areas of extreme potholes. The DIG application is due January 31, 2025 and will be filed.

Estimate for 500 Tons of Salt and Delivery

The Road Superintendent, John Onyshko observed the need for more salt to finish the rest of this winter and for November and December of 2025.

2025-31 Mr. Radtke moved to approve the purchase of up to \$37,600 payable Sagamore Companies for salt for roads.
Mr. Mazzurco seconded. Vote unanimous; motion passed.

Road Department 2025 Budget

The Board of Trustees and the Road Superintendent John Onyshko discussed the revenues and appropriations for the Road Department for 2025. Together they will navigate the forecasted projects and expenses. The discussion will continue.


